RESEARCH

On-going projects focus on agricultural price and forecasting, research priorities and policies for climate resilient agriculture, village household survey, water management, sustainable intensification of agriculture, farm mechanization, technology foresight in agriculture, Farmers FIRST Program, farmer producer organizations, value chains and exports, price volatility, outlook models for pulses and oilseeds, Direct Benefit Transfer, fertilizer price policies and crop insurance, Doubling Farmers' Income, export growth and policy reforms. Some new initiatives are:

- Institutions and technology for agricultural water management,
- Agricultural price analysis and forecasting,
- Progress of crop insurance, farmers' willingness to pay, and role of information to examine risk, and
- Village household survey for standardizing data collection methods/database development for agricultural rural households with special focus on weaker sections under SCSP.

Structural Transformation, Regional Disparity and Institutional Reforms in Agriculture

In less than a decade (2011-12 to 2019-20), the share of crops in total agricultural GVA has fallen from 65% to 56%, and livestock sector's share has risen from 22% to 29%. In other words, while growth was just 1.3% in crops, it has been 7.6% in livestock sector.

Fisheries sector has grown impressively by 9% at the national level. Crop sector has performed well in Madhya Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and West Bengal, and horticulture contributes 36% of crop sector output.

Consistent growth in horticulture, especially in fruits and vegetables, and in crops like pulses, coarse cereals, wheat, and groundnut had been the major sources of growth. Expansion of technologies such as micro-irrigation has played a crucial role in ensuring the growth. More than 11 million hectare of land has been brought so far under micro-irrigation in the country. Investment (public & private) in agriculture has grown by 6-8% during 2018-20, and expected positive growth in the coming years shall further enhance farmers' investment in improved technologies and high-value agriculture. Improvement in institutional lending shall support the private investment. With the recovering economic growth and household income, one can expect market-driven growth of high-value agriculture.

Dynamics in Global Crustaceans' Exports and Competitiveness: What it Holds for India?

The study discussed the pre and post-WTO trends in crustacean exports, trends in competitiveness and its linkages with the export performance. The study tried to examine the linkages and revealed comparative advantages of major exporters (India, Ecuador and Canada), the unit value realized for Indian crustaceans and Indian crustacean exports.

Crop Insurance in India: Progress, Farmers' Willingness to Pay and Role of Information

Annual number of farmers registered under National Agricultural Insurance Scheme (NAIS), 2000-01 to 2015-16 were 169.53 lakhs, while under Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY), 2016-17 to 2019-20 the number was 425.16 lakhs. The number of farmers benefitted annually under NAIS and PMFBY were 53.16 lakhs (29.88% of total registered farmers) and 147.33 lakhs (32.67% of total registered farmers). The sum insured to farmers premium ratio was 38.70 under NAIS and 51.57 under PMFBY suggests there is higher sum insured under PMFBY with given rupees. It is visible that the performance of PMFBY is higher over NAIS in terms of farmers insured, area covered, claims reported and paid. By creating the awareness and timely payment of claims, the coverage of PMFBY can be improved further.

Agroecosystem Diversity Index

Institute has developed the Agroecosystem Diversity Index (ADI) which encompasses three broad aspects, viz. diversity status at multi-levels (ecosystem, landscape, species and genetic), drivers of agrobiodiversity threats/losses, and societal response to reverse these losses. The ADI is the first of its kind to measure the diversity of agro-ecosystems at a regional level and it helps the policymakers to understand the opportunities to improve agrobiodiversity. The proposed index can also be used to identify agrobiodiversity hotspots and monitor agrobiodiversity targets at global, national and ecosystem levels. The model was validated with a case study of the Indo-Gangetic Plains of India.

Evaluation of ILSP Interventions

Initiated a project "Evaluation of successful interventions of the Integrated Livelihoods Support Project (ILSP) of Uttarakhand and the lessons for out-scaling" sponsored by the Government of Uttarakhand.

Rural Non-Farm Sector in India: Trends, Structural Changes, Farm Sector Growth and Poverty Linkages

Based on the latest Periodic Labour Force Survey 2018-19, the percentage of households self-employed in agriculture decreased from 37.8% in 2017-18 to 36.6% in 2018-19. This indicates a continuing shift in employment from agriculture to non-farm activities. The worker population ratio (usual status)was 52.1% for rural males and 19.0% for rural females. It has increased from 51.7% for rural male and 17.5% in rural female in 2017-18. This shows a positive improvement of employment in rural India.

Assessment of Ecosystem Services and Institutions in Watershed Management Programmes

The monetary value of environmental services delivered by watersheds in India was assessed using a meta-analysis approach. The total value of environmental watershed ecosystem services is Rs. 34113/ha/year, 60% of which is contributed by water augmentation. The stakeholder's participation in the planning and management of watersheds significantly enhances environmental watershed services. Macro-watersheds are more effective in generating ecosystem services.

Agricultural Development Report 2020-21

The report broadly covers performance of Indian agriculture and progress of various development schemes. The report has highlighted some of these developments and issues. Impact of COVID-19 on agriculture and rural economy and measures to revive the economy are special features of the report. Recent policy reforms of the Government, future outlook and budget expectations are other important features of the report.
